




The check was presented during a Reading Buddies celebration at Ann J. Kellogg School where Larvenda Williams is the lead student support coordinator for CIS.

"Your role as a Reading Buddy goes beyond fostering literacy skills," said Carter during the celebration attended by Reading Buddy volunteers and students. "You've provided our students with something equally important: a positive, caring adult relationship."

According to Carter, those bonds are critical to a child's overall success.

"You've given our students a mentor, a friend, and a

source of inspiration," she said. "Let us not forget the intangible lessons you've imparted – the values of empathy, patience and the joy of sharing stories."

Battle Creek State Farm Agents on hand to present the check were Chad Heeter, Kristin Wykoski, John Chmiel, Chase Anthes and District Manager Karl Smathers.

"State Farm appreciates Communities in Schools for the great work that they do," said Smathers. "In particular, we're excited about the program here in Battle Creek where one-on-one volunteers and students work together on reading. What a wonderful way to help people get started."

The check helps children all over the state, too, he said.

"This grant went out to several different districts and it went through Communities in Schools," he said.

DePerkel wanted to attend the event in Battle Creek to honor the Reading Buddies and to help accept the grant.

"They've given us money yearly but not this much," said DePerkel. "So, in the past its been \$15,000, but this is the largest donation from them ever. It's great news. We're thrilled to be a part of it. They've been a long time partner and this is

a good celebration of that."

The funds are expected to help the 45,000 youths across the state served by CIS, she said.

In all, there are about 12 volunteer Reading Buddies in the district.

CIS Program Director for BCPS and Grand Rapids Public Schools Nyekah Guest said Reading Buddies are also recruited via distributed flyers, via site coordinators who speak to the public and via a QR code on the flyers and on district websites

"We go to all of the community events within the city and we have our QR codes there," she said. "We are always recruiting, year round."

Pre-pandemic, Guest said there were roughly 300 Reading Buddies but when the program went virtual during the pandemic, many of the volunteers left the program.

"We lost quite a bit but now that we're back in the buildings and our orientations are in person," she said, "we're able to get more people."

Last year, there were roughly 35 readers, she said.

Reading assistance happens during the school day and Reading Buddies can help more than one student per week.

Reading Buddy Zena Perry, a CIS senior accounting manager, is also a crossing guard and occasional lunch room helper at Dudley STEM School.

She has helped six or seven students with their reading skills, she said.

A majority of the volunteer readers are senior citizens, said Guest. Many are retired teachers.

"Retired teachers are the best asset that we have," she

## Wall That Heals plaque dedicated at HCHS






